

Hot meals and a Serving of Compassion

In November 2020, Typhoon Goni hit the Philippines, bringing torrential rains, violent winds, mudslides, and storm surges that impacted many regions and communities in the country. In the following days additional storms and flooding brought more destruction and suffering.

MCC Marikina, in Marikina City, led by Pastor Jason Michael Masaganda was quick to respond to the spiritual and physical needs of the disaster survivors. The church organized relief efforts in five waves that began on November 11, 2020 after the typhoon hit and continued through mid-December.



The church fed hot, fresh cooked meals to over 800 people, provided water, toiletry items, blankets for those who lost their homes, and grocery bags full of food, as well as prayers and encouragement. MCC Marikina, an Emerging Church has, since its beginning, been actively involved in ministries of social justice, service, and outreach.
